## COMMENT FROM DIANE WAKE, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

We use agency staff to cover staff shortages and ensure our patients are safe and cared for by appropriately skilled staff at all times. Because of the high demand on our services throughout December and January, we opened extra beds in the hospital and used a number of temporary staff to support us in caring for these extra patients.

Our use of agency staff will obviously reduce once we are able to fill vacant posts and we are doing all we can to recruit. We also have new systems in place to control the way agency spend is authorised.

The exact amount spent on agency staff for 2017/18 is not available until our yearend accounts are agreed in May 2017. However, we expect to spend approximately £3 million less on agency than we did in 2016/17.

In October 2017 we appointed a dedicated recruitment lead and refocused our recruitment campaign to attract local, home-grown talent. This approach is really paying off; since October we have recruited 135.81 whole time equivalent staff to a variety of posts.

We hold monthly recruitment open days and those attending have the opportunity to be interviewed on the day, speak to our clinical teams and tour the areas they could be working. Successful candidates could even receive conditional offers of employment before they leave.
