Paragraph/s relating to The Dudley Group	The General Medical Council has warned that any locum doctors engaging in "unreasonable withdrawal" from work could exacerbate pressure on health services and potentially risk patient safety.
	Other trusts have also since come forward to confirmed the tax changes have affected them, including The Dudley Group Foundation Trust. Press enquiry	HSJ contacted the Trust relating to new IR35 regulations for temporary staff. The HSJ had received reports about examples of staff refusing to work due to the regulations coming into force.
	The Trust was asked if it had heard about any locums refusing to work shifts due to the new regulations and what was being done to mitigate any gaps in rotas to maintain safety.
